Key Themes:

"Middle school model supports the children at this critically developmental age, likelihood that they will find an adult to connect with."

"Loved the LSS student, he convinced me. I loved the empowerment of the choices they have at middle school. They have the opportunity to explore. Great that they have some choices. Having more choices is great."

"As a parent and volunteer participant in the Yorkson Creek school community, I would recommend the middle school model to anyone who asks."

"Fantastic opportunities yes ... but will the middle school in Walnut Grove have the same opportunities as others?"

Key Themes:

Another transition for students

Question if there is adequate professional development in support of this model for teachers

How will students be effected during the transition to this model?

Can't this model simply be implemented at elementary and secondary schools?

Going Forward:

"Elementary schools and secondary schools are doing bits and pieces of the pillars, but the structure of middle school covers it all."

Economies of scale pose a significant challenge to provide the facilities, collaboration opportunities and staffing supports to enable these benefits to take place in a non-middle school configuration.

One parent stated "Most parents I talk to are okay with the middle school system but are more interested in the next steps and how it will be implemented."
