Big Ideas in Kindergarten

Daily physical activity helps us develop movement skills and physical literacy, and is an important part of healthy living. Learning about ourselves and others helps us develop a positive attitude and caring behaviours, which helps us build healthy relationships.

Knowing about our bodies and making healthy choices helps us look after ourselves.

Good health comprises physical, mental, and emotional well-being.

Personal Identity Example

- Kindergarten/Grade
 - Identify personal skills, interests, and preferences
- ▶ Grade 4/5
 - Explore and describe how personal identities adapt and change in different settings and situations
- ► Grade 8/9
 - Explore and describe factors that shape personal identities, including social and cultural factors

What's new Review

- ▶ A holistic, life time model
- Social and Mental Health has moved from Health and Career Education to Physical and Health Education
- Inclusion of sexual orientation and gender identity
- Substance use/misuse carries through all grades
- Includes mental wellness and illness
